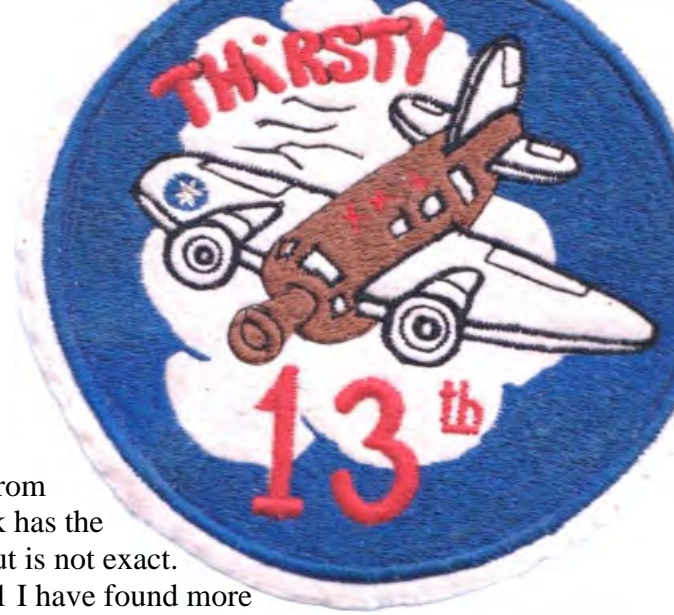


February 2021 Newsletter



Dear Thirsty 13th members, relatives, and friends,

The last newsletter, January 23, 2021, had four photos from Voorhees taken in our first camp at Dulag, Leyte. The book has the location of that camp and general locations of the photos, but is not exact. For the ten years since completing the book in October 2011 I have found more photos of Dulag. I have wanted to analyze these and present this camp again, and so from January 28 to February 23, I spent from 6 to 14 hours a day on this. The officers’ area was very hard.

This newsletter focusses exclusively on the Dulag camp. Of the 815 members who served overseas, 389 moved to our camp in Dulag, almost half the members. We were here for the shortest time – an advance group arrived 7/17/45, our headquarters 8/17/45, and most men left on or before 9/22/45, but we should still try to know more specifically where the tents were. To learn the dates your relative was here, press Alt-e, then f (find), and type a last name, and this will take you to an appendix added at the end of this – but only for the men who moved here.

1. Additional History

a. 1945: Dulag Camp Entrance Area

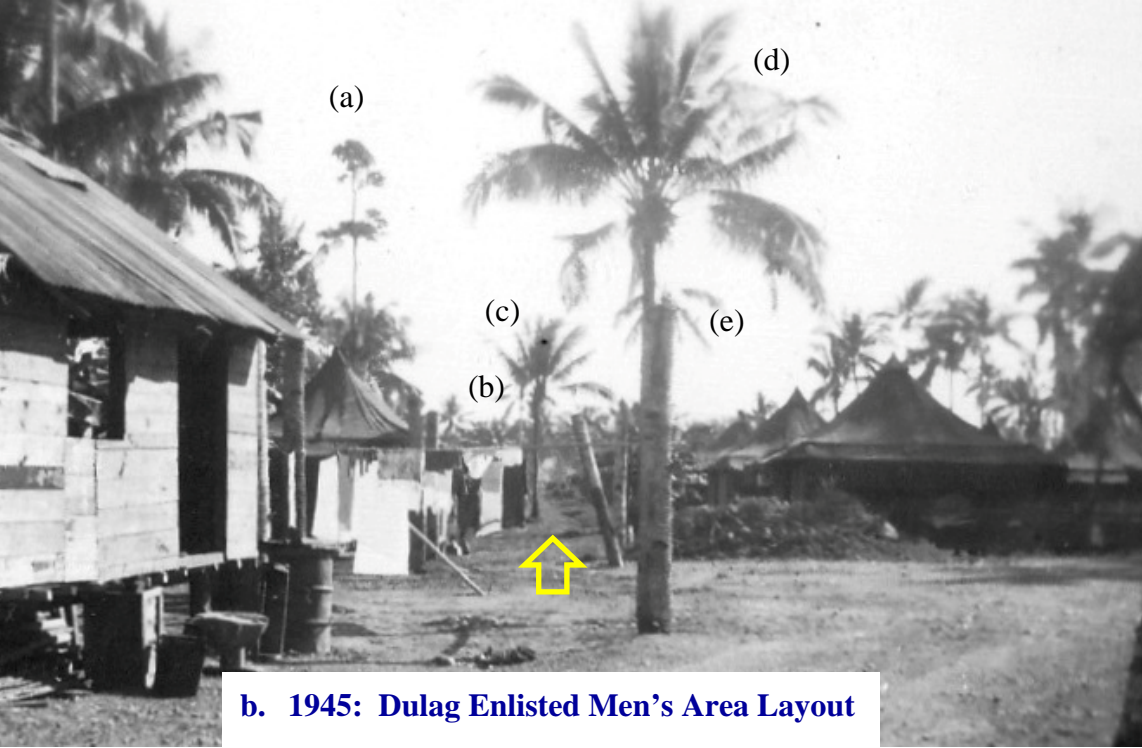
The book on page 696 has the image at right of this camp, taken between July 19-23, 1945, 2 to 6 days after our advance party moved here July 17 to prepare this camp, so it has few structures. I have never found another aerial photo, so the camp layout must be determined from ground photos.

The next image (many herein are also in the book) is in the direction of the pink arrow. On 2/1, I noticed that the two palm trees circled are the same as in the image below (from Korty), and so the view below is south on our entrance road. In the background is 2,820-foot Mahagnao volcano. The yellow arrow points to a side road to our enlisted area.

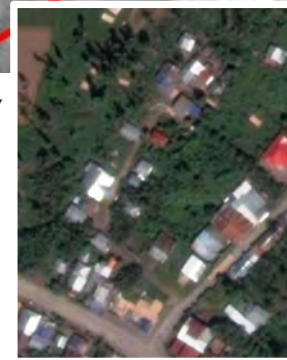
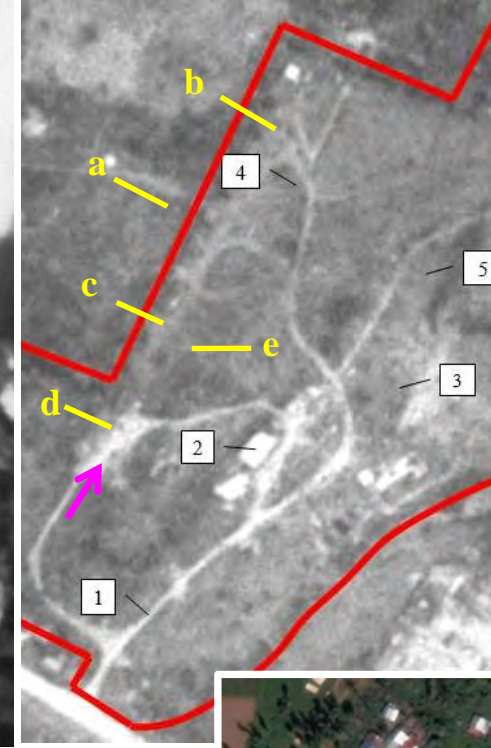
The building by the green arrow at right, shown up close at left, was moved in the photo below. It may be the building on a platform, estimated for two electricity generators (the same black line on the roof), or we moved a Filipino home.

I estimate there was a road left of this building to our officers' area. The jeeps lined-up mean this was the motor pool. Another image, at right, shows a long shed here for the motor pool. Voorhees' photo, inset, was by this long shed.



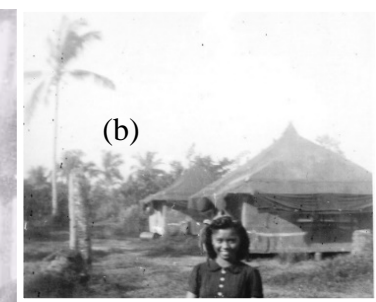


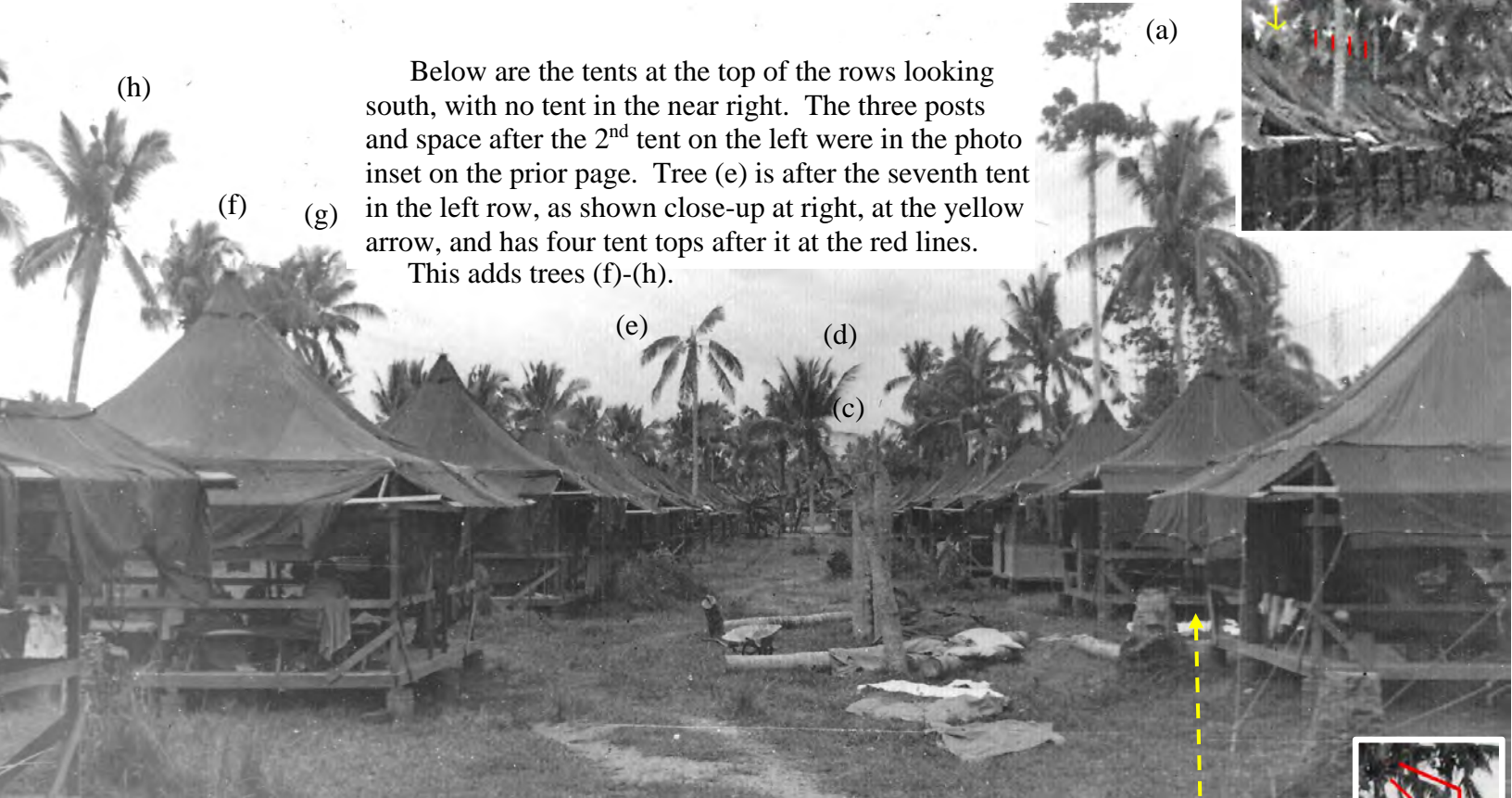
b. 1945: Dulag Enlisted Men's Area Layout



I found the photo above left when I visited the daughter of Gates in Moline, Ill, in July 2015. After the Filipino home on the left is laundry hung out to dry then a row of tents, with a tall tree labelled (a) above them. Along this main path are palm trees (b) to (d), at locations marked on the aerial image. Off the path to the right and partially hidden is tree (e) with all but one frond pointed down. On the right are at least two more rows of tents. This photo was taken from the pink arrow, above right. The road along the pink arrow was still there in 2021, as shown at right. That Gates had this photo suggests some of our enlisted men used this side road, also on the prior page, to get to and from the Dulag road.

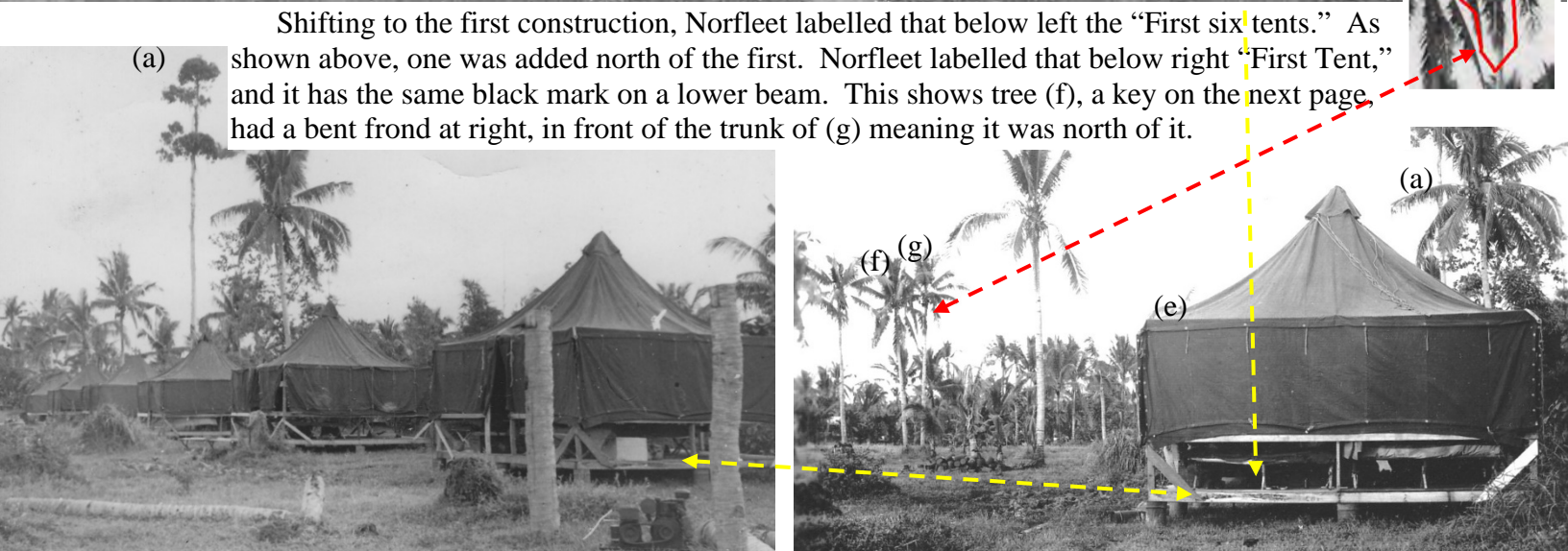
From the yellow arrow above was the photo below from Markey with the trees (a), (b), (c) and (e). There are an estimated 8 tents on the left, 9 on the right, and two behind the photographer, for 10 + 11 total. Tree (e) is after the 2nd tent on the right, fourth from this south end, key later. The stump by the fifth tent on the left is also in the photo inset at left of Braham. Tree (b) is shown again at right (from Surnack), with three posts overlapping on the left, and south of the near tent is a space with a stump.



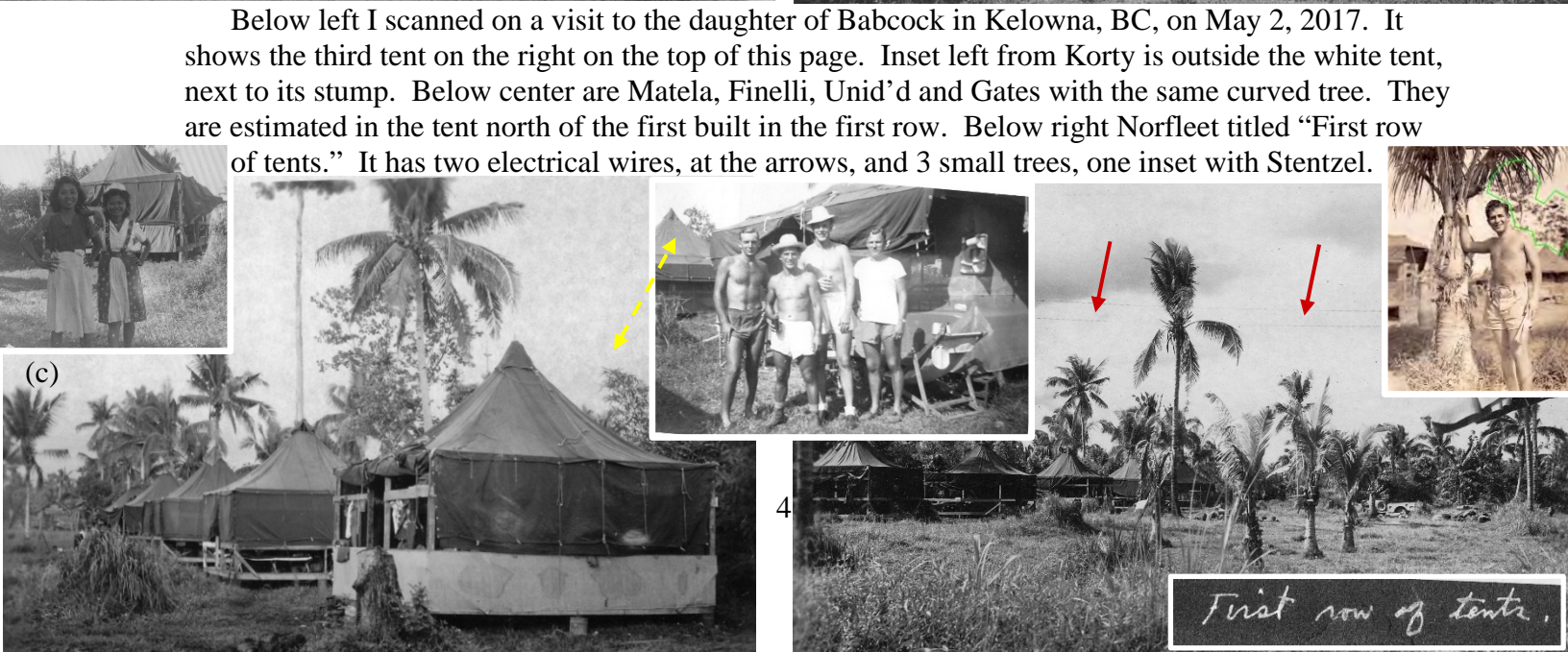


Below are the tents at the top of the rows looking south, with no tent in the near right. The three posts and space after the 2nd tent on the left were in the photo inset on the prior page. Tree (e) is after the seventh tent in the left row, as shown close-up at right, at the yellow arrow, and has four tent tops after it at the red lines.

This adds trees (f)-(h).



Shifting to the first construction, Norfleet labelled that below left the "First six tents." As shown above, one was added north of the first. Norfleet labelled that below right "First Tent," and it has the same black mark on a lower beam. This shows tree (f), a key on the next page, had a bent frond at right, in front of the trunk of (g) meaning it was north of it.



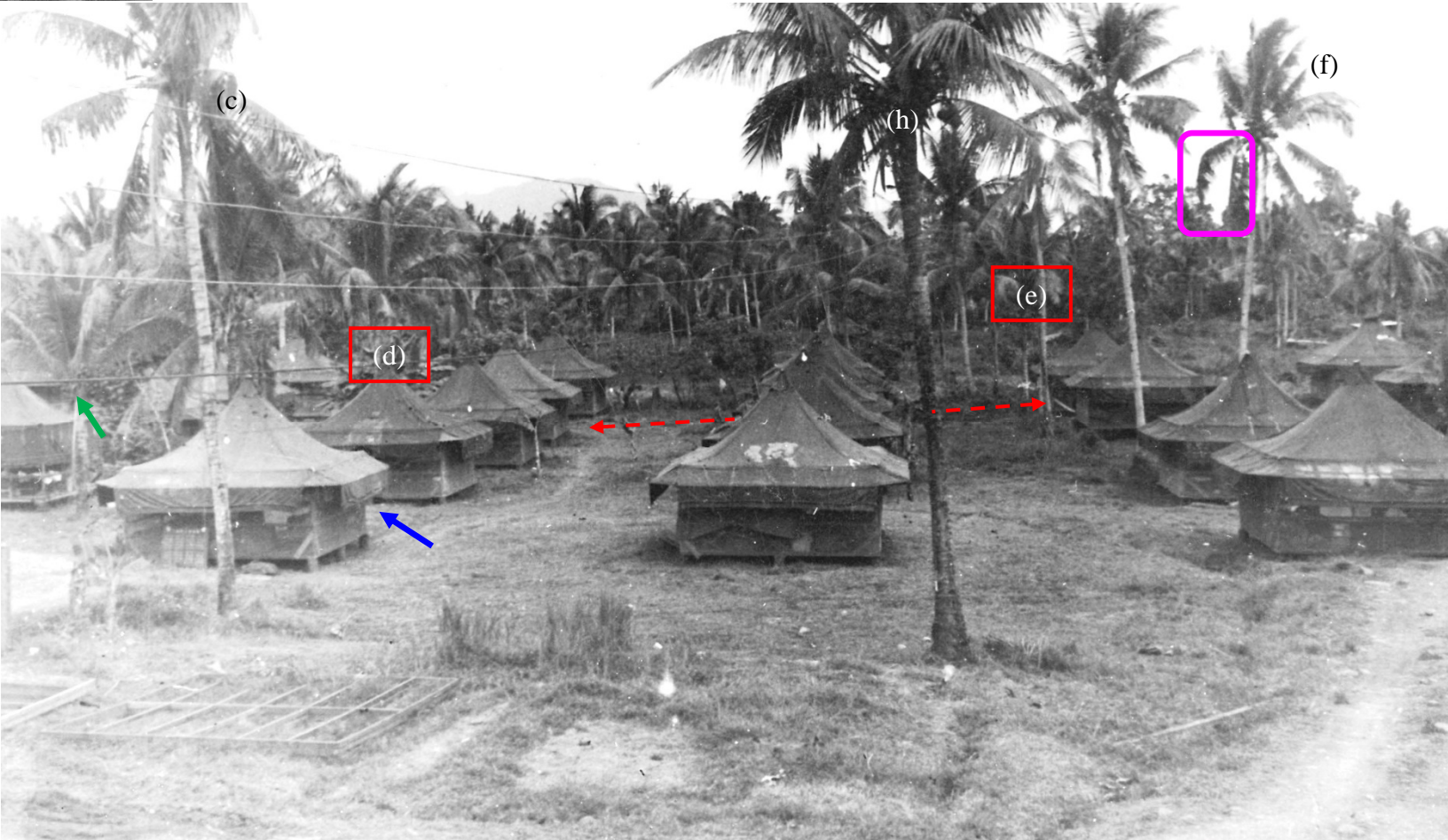
Below left I scanned on a visit to the daughter of Babcock in Kelowna, BC, on May 2, 2017. It shows the third tent on the right on the top of this page. Inset left from Kory is outside the white tent, next to its stump. Below center are Matela, Finelli, Unid'd and Gates with the same curved tree. They are estimated in the tent north of the first built in the first row. Below right Norfleet titled "First row of tents." It has two electrical wires, at the arrows, and 3 small trees, one inset with Stentzel.

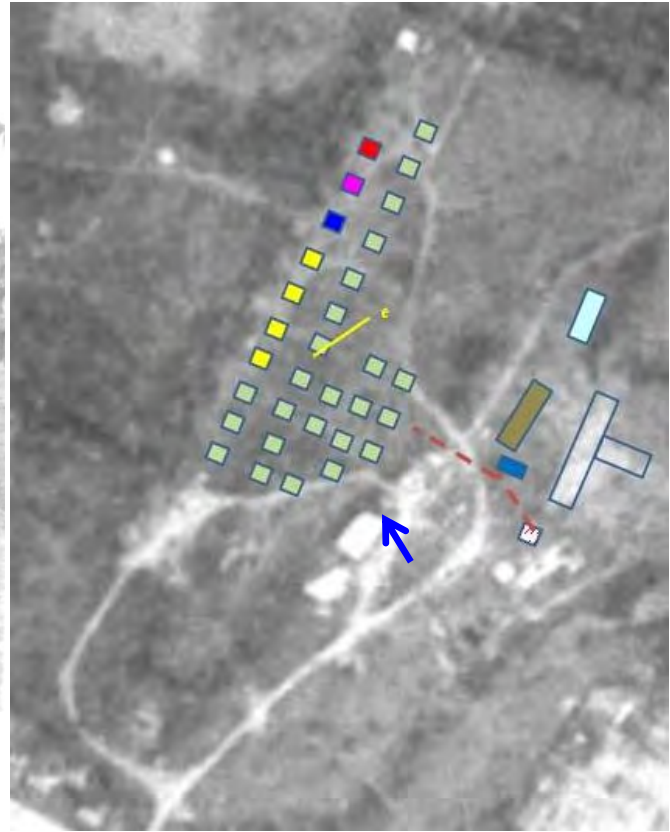
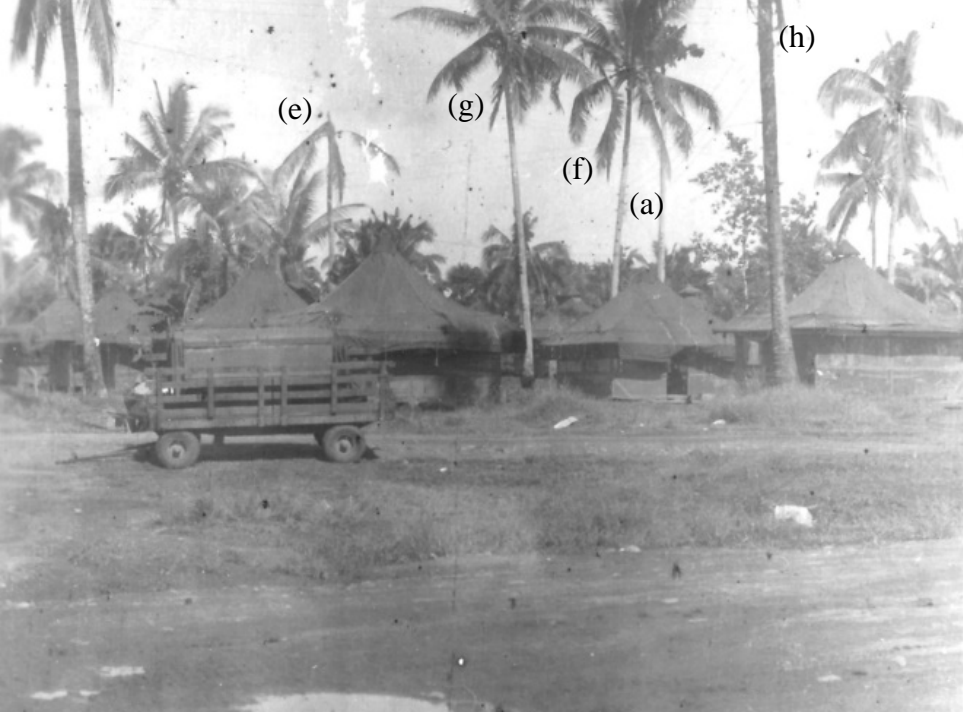


Above is the second row of tents, east of the main path, in a view in the direction of the yellow arrow at right, over the path. At the red arrows are the tops of tents in the first row. As noted on the prior page, there is no first-row tent across from the first in the second row.



The image below looks west, with 4,426-foot Mt. Lobi faintly visible above the trees, after lightening the photo. This has four electrical lines, two more than on the prior page. Tree (f) has the same bent palm pond frond as on the prior page. One can't see the top of (e), but the lower fronds are the same, and this was its position relative to the other trees and tents. This indicates the main path is where indicated by the dashed red line between the farthest west two tents. The prior pages noted tree (e) had four tents south of it, and the southernmost is at the green arrow. The path on the right does not go to a tent door, so was there previously. In the lower left are frames for additional tent floors. The photo at left of Voorhees and Gold with bushes behind them was at the blue arrow, so they were in the tent under (d).

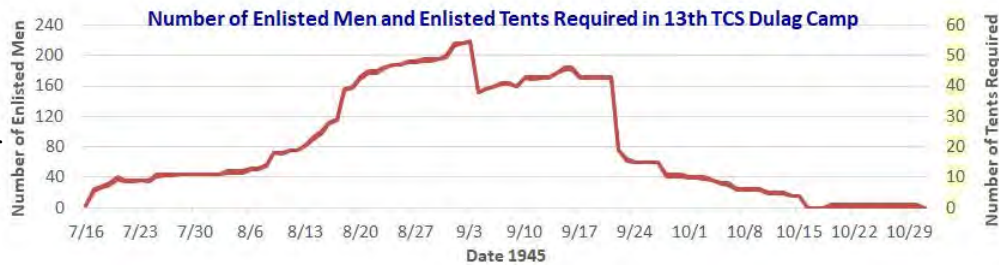




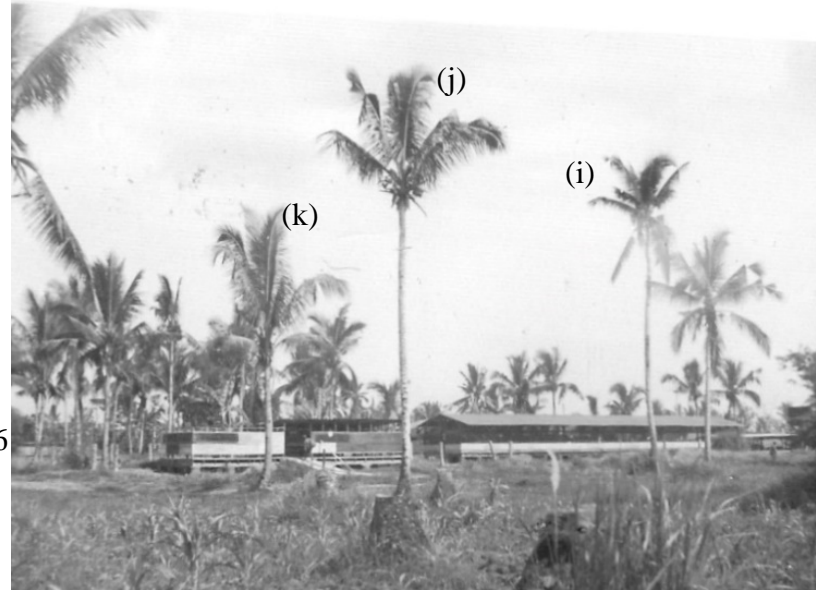
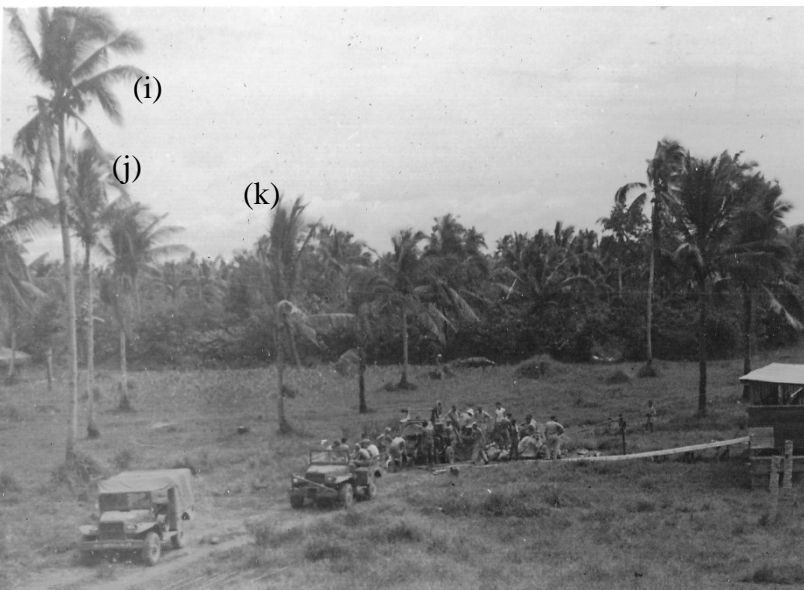
Voorhees had the photo above, showing trees (a) and (e) to (h), estimated in the direction of the blue arrow at right.

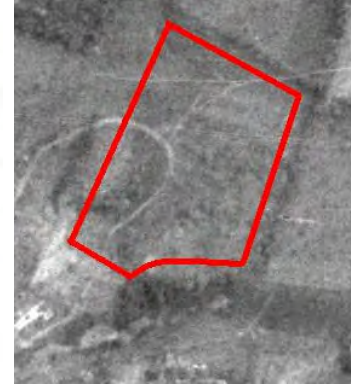
The tent locations are summarized above right. The first tent built is in pink, that of Babcock blue, and the other first-six are in yellow, then Finelli and Gates in red. Row 1 had an estimated 10 tents, row 2 had 11. The area above left, also at the bottom of the prior page, viewed west 4-5 tents deep, is roughly as indicated. This is south of where I estimated in the last newsletter. Determining the north-south location of these two photos was a main motivator for this analysis. This is consistent with the wires from the electricity generator at the dashed red line above right.

As shown at right, the 13th TCS had about 40 enlisted men in Dulag by July 20, 1945, to set up the camp, and, at four men per tent, needed 10 tents. We did not need more until around August 9.



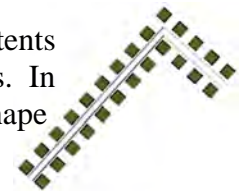
Our tent needs increased to an estimated 53 tents. The image top right has 31 tents, and so we had to add 22 more, perhaps 3 rows of 7, east of the 2nd row. This north area is shown below left, looking north from the mess hall area, showing on the left tents stopped close to the north end. Below right is looking back at the showers and mess hall. Trees (i), (j) and (k) are in each.





c. 1945: Dulag Officers' Area Layout

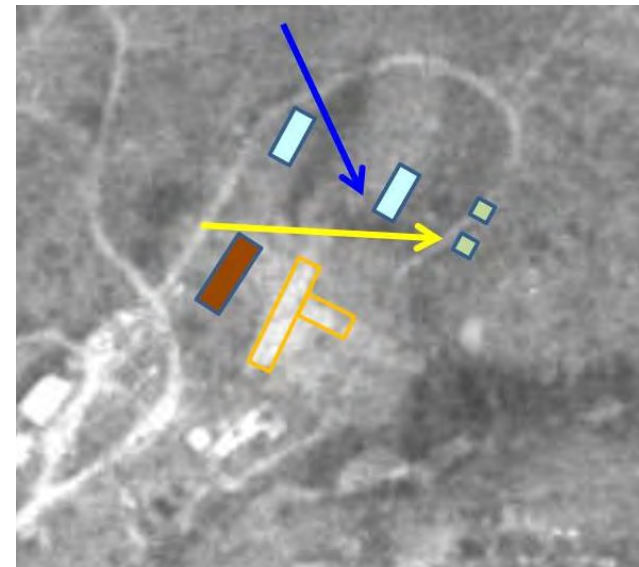
As shown above, from August 23 to September 29, 1945, the squadron ramped up to 25 tents in the officers' area, with a temporary need for 29, or adding a fifth man to some 4-man tents. In the book on page 705 I stated they were in the area outlined above right, in a backwards L shape as at right, that being 26 tents. I have wanted to make this more exact.



The officers' tent layout took a long time to figure out. From February 2-23, I spent about 10 hours every day studying trees, shadows, mountains, bushes, and structures in about 80 photos to find clues. I did not get my first breakthrough until the eighth day, February 9, at 11 a.m., realizing one mountain was another. Even then, I had far to go, taking 14 days more.

I wrote up what I did as I went along, and it was a long write-up. I wanted to remember and share the challenges and discoveries, but on 2/14/ decided it better to present only the results. The following were the key steps.

1. Officers' shower view – Below right (also from Gates in July 2015) is the view in the direction of the blue arrow at right, of the enlisted men's shower, and on the left in the trees one can see a structure, with an open clerestory, estimated to be the officers' shower. According to Korty, there was only one well drilled for this camp. Water was pumped up into four pontoons, two of which would be chlorinated, while the others were used, then they switched these around. It makes sense the officers' shower would be near the enlisted shower.



2. Tents near the shower – Below left from Markey and enlarged is the view in the direction of the yellow arrow, of the enlisted men's club, and in the background are some tents – officers' tents. The tent side is almost parallel to the club.

The shower and tent provide a western end for the officers' "L" line of tents, and a direction – based on the tent side angle. Two tents are added to the aerial view above.

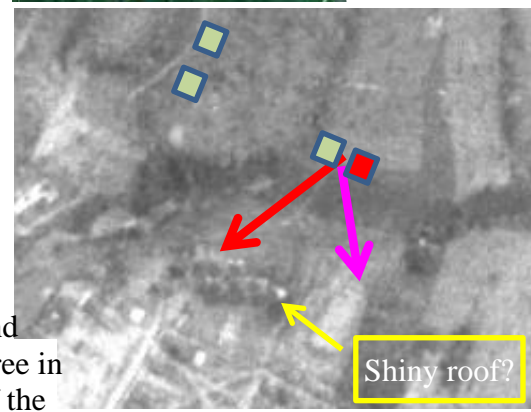
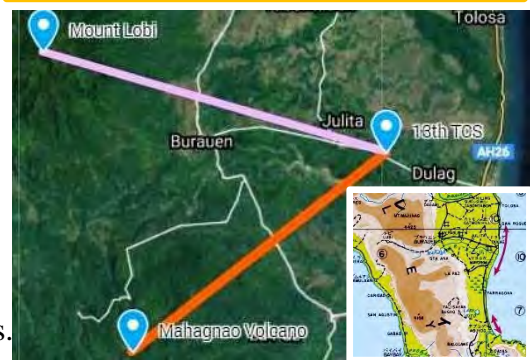




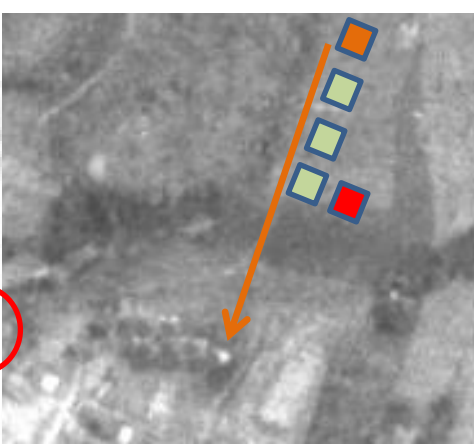
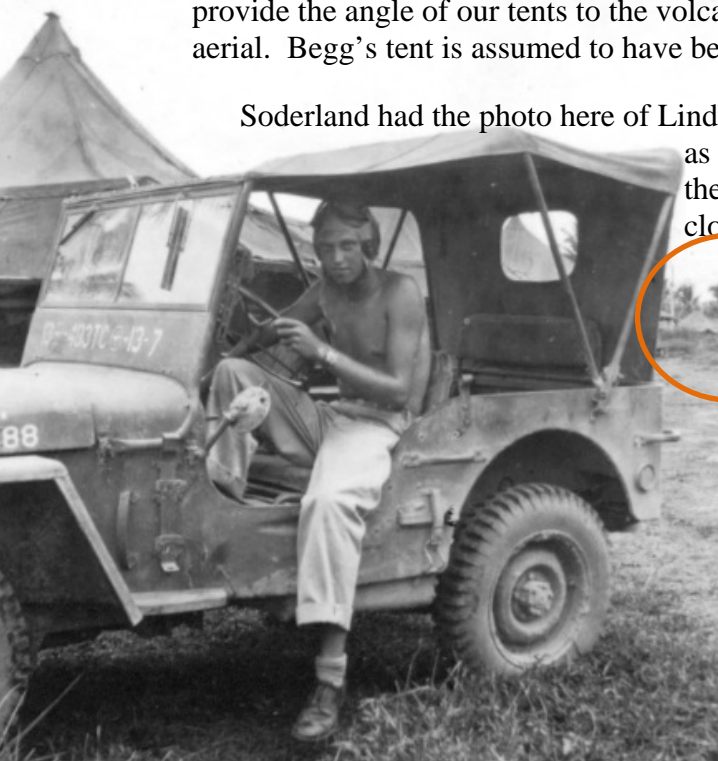
3. Southwest View – On 4/7/17 I received a box from the daughter, Terry, of pilot Begg, with three photos, cropped above, of a young Filipino woman, which were in the April 2017 newsletter. That above right has a mountain. As shown at right, to the northwest of our camp was Mt. Lobi, and to the southwest was Mahagnao volcano. The other tents are close-by so this seemed to be NW to our enlisted area.

Top left is Mt. Lobi, then Mahagnao from our entrance road, then that above right, so this is Mahagnao, and a view of the unit south of us.

The woman is standing along the red line at right, the direction of the volcano, with the tip of the arrow on the third tent in the front row of the unit south of us. The view above left shows the end of a long building in that camp, the pink arrow. There is an open field between our camps, and the aerial shows no bushes here. The photos above provide the angle of our tents to the volcano sight line, as added to the aerial. Begg's tent is assumed to have been where shown in red.



Soderland had the photo here of Lindberg with the same background as above. The trunk of the tall tree in the above right photo was left of the closest tent top, and is now right, meaning this is west of Begg. The 13th TCS tent tops point along the orange line below. Soderland said his tent was by a corn field, and this is where this is. The photo and aerial show there are no palm trees close-by in this direction.

A Note about Solar Angles

Photos on the prior two pages had reference points – the officers’ shower was shown relative to the enlisted shower, and the Begg tent was shown relative to Mahagnao volcano. Tents in other photos have no major reference points, only other tents, palm trees, and shadows. The solar angle was helpful to determine the direction of photos, including two on the next pages.

Pilot Wib Creelman was in this camp 8/15-9/22. He had the photo below left (also on the next page). Pilot Ralsey Scofield was in this camp 8/24-9/22 and had the photo below right.



The images below are from the online NOAA Solar Calculator, with the marker over this area. The green and faint red lines are the direction of the sun at sunrise and sunset on 8/22/45, around when Creelman and Scofield arrived here. For clarity I do not show these on 9/22/45, but for 9/22 these are each about 20° south of their position and move south of an east-west line.

The purple lines are the direction of the sun when it had an elevation of 45° on 8/22 and 9/22. When shadows are more than 45° long, the sun is from almost due east or due west. The shadows in the above pictures each have a sun elevation of about 45°, as shown at right for that above right. The bright red lines can be ignored, as they are references, 90° to the purple lines.

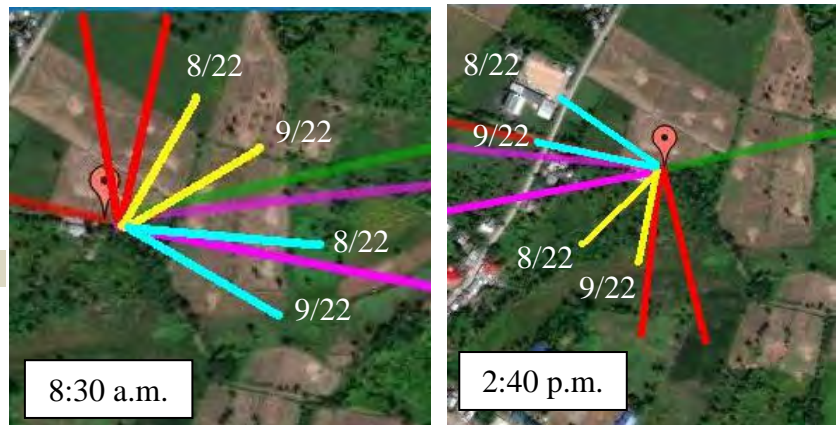

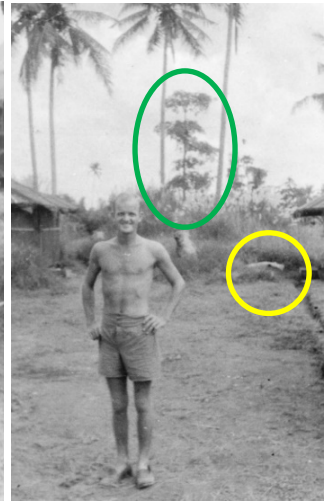
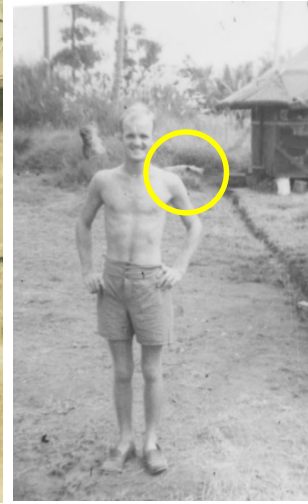
Upper lines: 8/22/45

Lower lines: 9/22/45 (more likely)



In the above left image, the view down the left row of tents is at about a 45° angle to the sun, and one would look left of the purple lines. This is drawn in yellow (halfway between the purple and red lines), for 8/22 and 9/22, morning and afternoon. That view is then looking NE or SW.

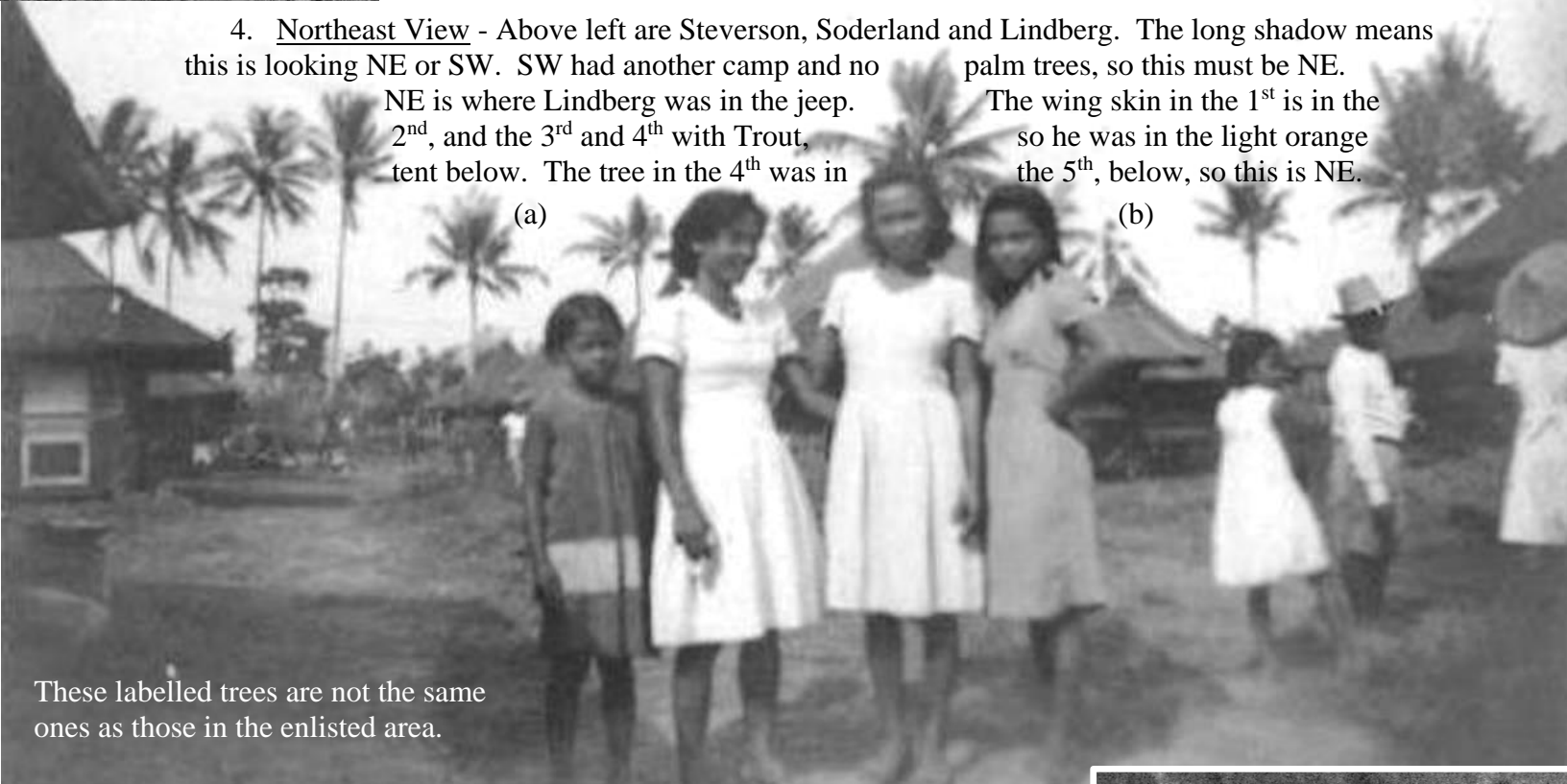
In the photo above right the row of tents is right of the direction of the sun by about 30°. This is drawn in blue, for 8/22 and 9/22, a.m. and p.m. Scofield is looking NW or SE.



4. Northeast View - Above left are Steverson, Soderland and Lindberg. The long shadow means this is looking NE or SW. SW had another camp and no palm trees, so this must be NE. NE is where Lindberg was in the jeep. The wing skin in the 1st is in the 2nd, and the 3rd and 4th with Trout, tent below. The tree in the 4th was in the 5th, below, so this is NE.

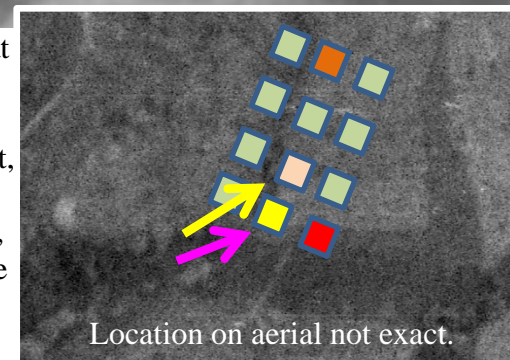

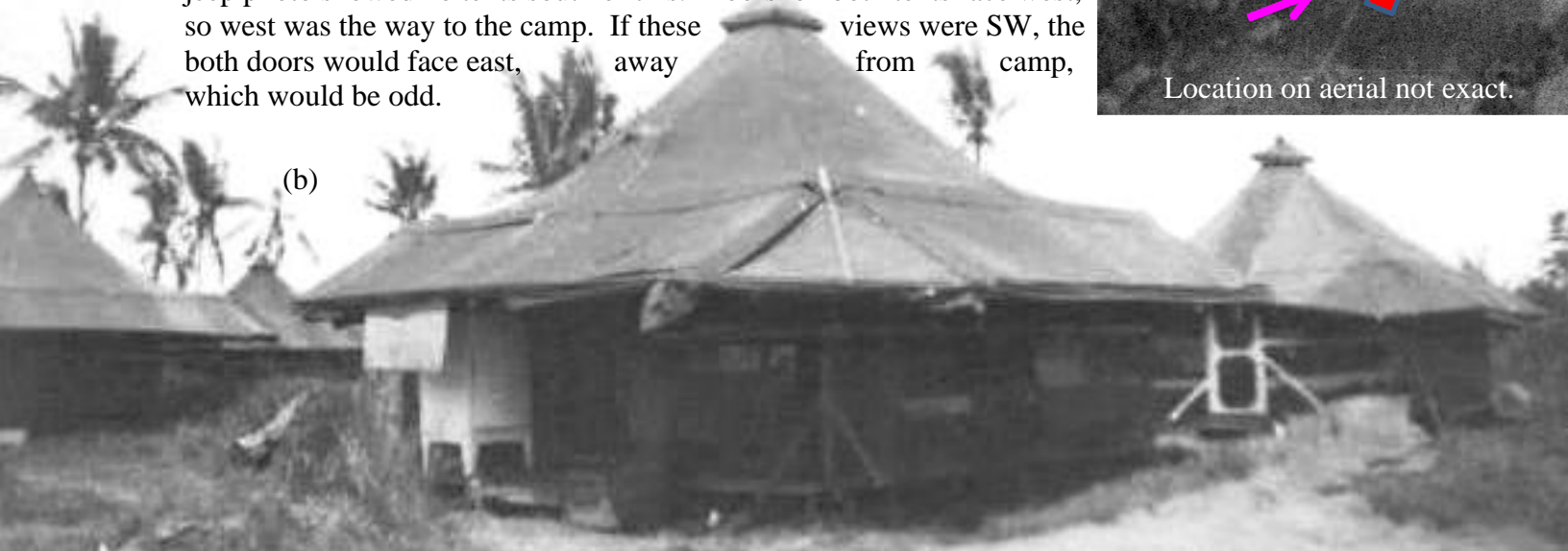


These labelled trees are not the same ones as those in the enlisted area.

Creelman had the photo above, in the direction of the yellow arrow at right. This adds a row on the left, and a row east of this. The photo below is a view a few steps to the right of that above, because tree (b) moved to the right of the tent top, so is the pink arrow of Creelman's tent, in yellow. There is just one tent to the right of his, that of Begg. The jeep photo showed no tents south of this. Doors on both tents face west, so west was the way to the camp. If these views were SW, the both doors would face east, away from camp, which would be odd.



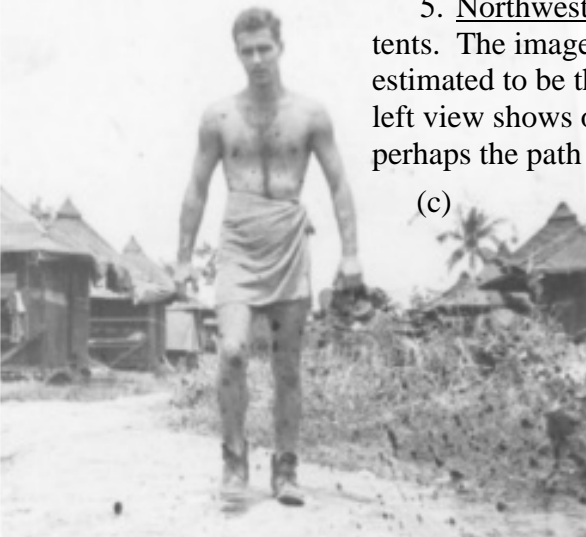
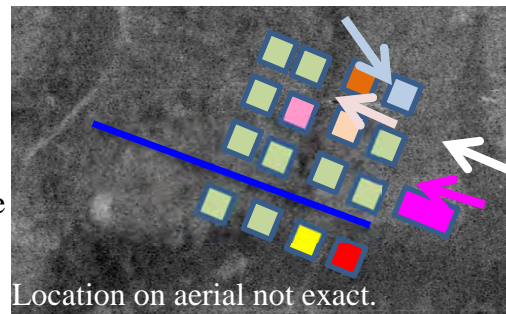

5. Northwest View – The views above show 3 rows of tents. The image above right has a path at the blue arrow, estimated to be the main path, in blue at right. The above left view shows only 4 more tents in the center row, but perhaps the path jogged left blocking seeing the long row.



The above are estimated taken at the pink arrow, with the left edge tent pink. The tree on the left is not (a). Below right of Lindberg shows the tent left of the jeep with boards leaning against it.

At left is James Buchen on the main path with same tree (c) and shade over a tent to block the 5:30 a.m. sunrise as above right, returning from the shower.

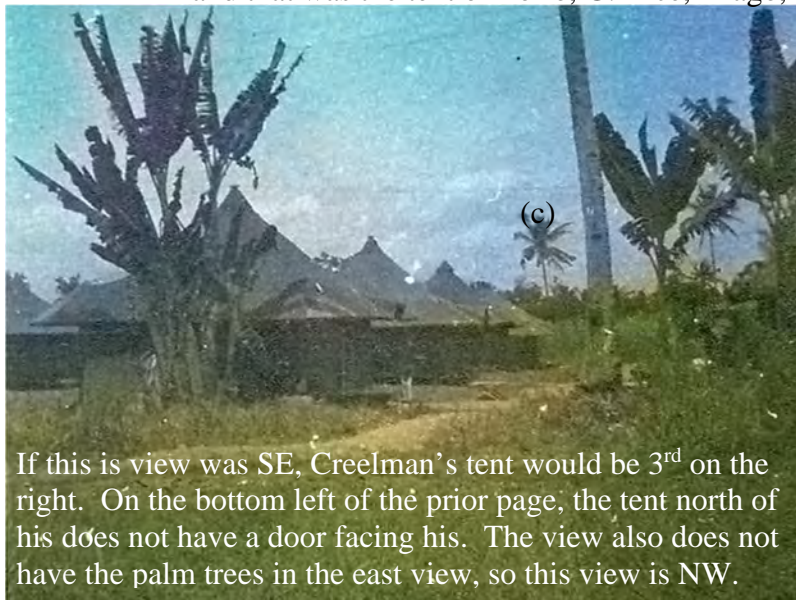


The row on the right in the above images is below left (colorized), shared by Willman in August 2017, a view at the white arrow. The tents have roof notches over the doors. On the right edge is a V-shaped palm and a tent, indicating another row to the right.

At right from Domarski in the direction of the light pink arrow, the light red tent was Trueba, Freudenthal, Domarski, and Finkbeiner.



Creelman had that below right, with the V-shaped palm and path on the right edge of Willman's photo, in the direction of the light blue arrow, and that was the tent of Lorio, G. Rice, Drago, Nitrauer, and DeCoursey.

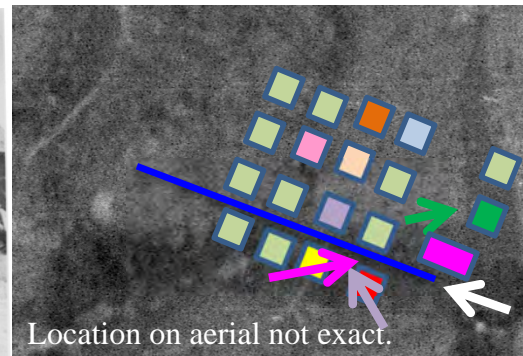
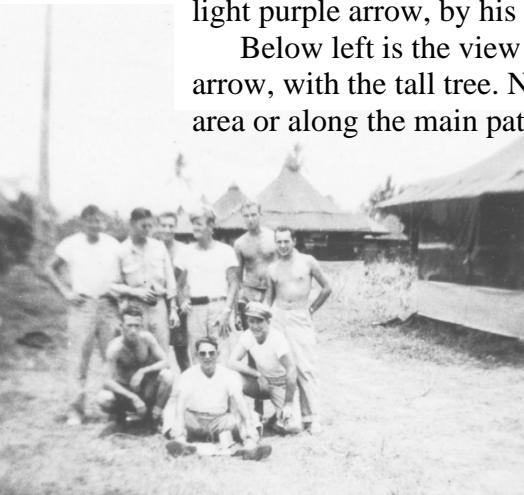


If this is view was SE, Creelman's tent would be 3rd on the right. On the bottom left of the prior page, the tent north of his does not have a door facing his. The view also does not have the palm trees in the east view, so this view is NW.

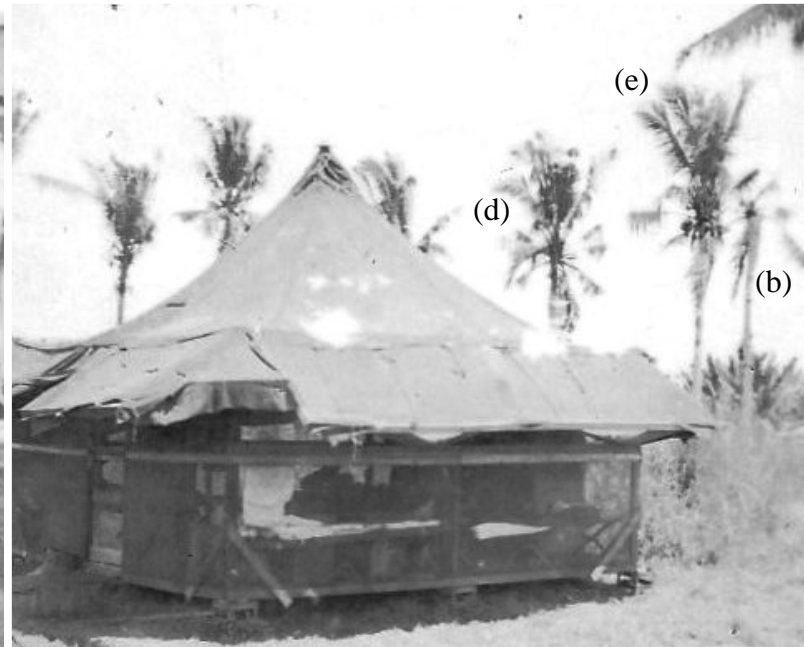
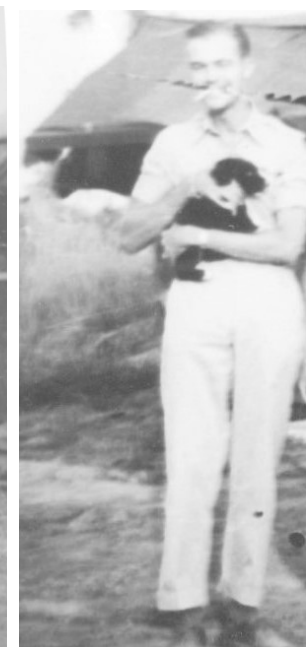


6. Southeast View – At right of Allard and Jacklin is in the direction of the pink arrow, with a pm shadow, of the tent in pink (boards leaning against it; the road this side of it hidden by long grass). This tent is two together, perhaps a club, at the east end like at Biak. This has tree (d), with a fish-tail, and a tall tree on the right edge. Above with Allard is a view estimated at the light purple arrow, by his estimated tent.

Below left is the view perhaps at the white arrow, with the tall tree. Next is a view in this area or along the main path further west.

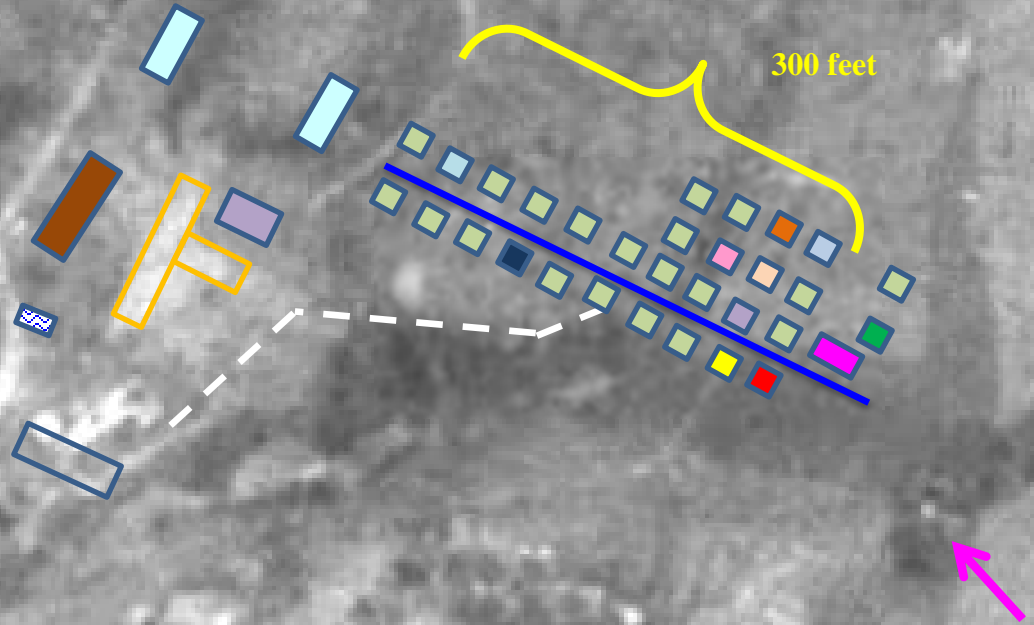


Below left is Scofield by his tent, estimated the same as that of Jenkins, below right, with a similar tree (d). This, or tree (e) below right, was the fish-tail tree in the Allard photo, so is a view from the green arrow, and they were in the green tent. Next, he holds the same dog Lindberg held on the prior page next to the pink tent. These show another tent left of Scofield's, added above.

These tent locations are best-estimates. If Lindberg's jeep was not by his tent, but a few rows west, then Begg (red) could also be northwest a few, not last in his row, and these could all extend further east.



Officers' Area Summary – The officers' area is shown estimated above in 1945 and below today.

It makes sense that the shower would be parallel to the enlisted men's shower and tents a straight line 90° to the shower. Golomb stated "I was the 2nd tent on the left from the mess hall" and so his is noted. Goddin stated he walked left to the shower, a long row, and a few tents to his right was the entrance to the area, estimated with a dashed white line; his tent is in dark blue.

Creelman said the tents were in an L-shape, and he was on the end, with maybe 5 in his row and 10 up and down. Soderland stated "We were on an outside row because there were banana palms nearby. We were at the opposite end from the showers." This is 30 tents in all.

The bushes by the pink arrow are still there today, and the fields have the same outline.

Tents were an estimated 16 feet long per side, and these 300 feet provide 14 feet between tents, on average. On 2/15 I spoke to pilot Laycock, but he did not remember the details. In the image below, the smooth green area south of us during rainy season is a bend in a stream.

d. 1945: Dulag Camp Area Today

Google Street View has the images on this page. Above is the main road looking southeast to the airfield, village, and gulf. The second telephone pole faintly visible is in the same place as one in 1945 on page 2. The view northwest on this road is at right, showing Mt. Lobi.

After turning onto our camp road, the view today is as shown below. On the left is the cutoff to the enlisted men's area. The view leaving the camp, of Mahagnao volcano, is below right.



The camp entrance road has homes, banana trees and other shrubs blocking views of the camp, as shown at right.

Further north on this road there is one spot to get the view below left, of our enlisted men's tent area, which seems to have the same tree (c) as on page 11, at left. Palm trees can live 100 years or more, and now we are 76 years later.



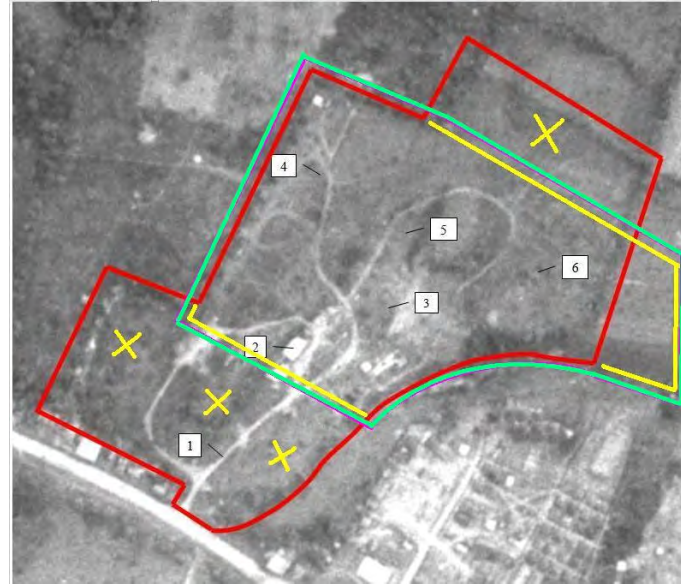
Further north on this road is the view below right, toward the officers' area, and a house, oriented east-west, is around where our officers' tents started, also on the prior page. This is close to where Norfleet's house, inset at right, may have been, but is at a different angle to the sun and has a different roof angle and shape.



e. 1945: Dulag Other Observations

Camp Boundary – In the book I estimated the camp boundary as the red line at right, but it now appears the areas with yellow Xs were not used, and the area outlined in yellow in the east was used. The border is now estimated as outlined in green.

Mess hall location – While analyzing the tent locations, I realized the mess hall was directly over the white area under #3 at right. Still to be determined are the location of the PX, and of Norfleet’s house.



Seeking an Aerial Image – On 2/13, it occurred to me that perhaps the monthly reports for the unit southeast of us included an aerial image of their area, which would include our tents in the background. I searched online and made a list of other units based at Dulag (403rd HQ, 2nd Combat Cargo HQ and 5th-8th squadrons, 17th photo recon, 20th mapping). I emailed my contact in Montgomery, Ala., who does contract research at Maxwell AFB’s Historical Research Agency, George Cully, and asked him to please review monthly files for these units for July-October 1945.

2. History Related Activities

a. Similar Title to 13th TCS Book Two Years c/o Postmaster

On January 4, 2021, during an online search for our squadron book “Two Years c/o Postmaster” I found “c/o Postmaster,” shown at right, published in 1943. This may have inspired the name of our book.

“c/o Postmaster” is a collection of stories by Thomas “Ozzie” St. George, a student in the School of Journalism at the University of Minnesota, about his WWII Army training, voyage across the Pacific, and year in Australia. The San Francisco Chronicle printed his stories, and readers loved them, and here they were collected in a book.

The author wrote “With most of us, this army career is by far the greatest experience we will ever have. I only hope that in reading about a few of these experiences you get half the kick out of it that we got when they were happening to us...”

The reference on the cover to the Matsonia Line is to the same shipping company on which some of the 13th TCS sailed from New Caledonia to Espiritu Santo.



3. Members and Relatives

a. Added a Birth Month for One of the Two Members Missing a Month and Day

For James Stanley Stratton, 1919-1943, I did not have a birth month or day. On 1/7/21, I contacted a relative of his on Ancestry. She replied on 1/8/21, that the 1920 census, in his town on January 9-10, 1920, listed him as 11 months old, so he was born around February 9, 1919.

4. Conclusions and Thanks

The camp at Dulag is now better defined. Thanks to all who shared the photos herein.
