Dear Thirsty 13th members, relatives, and friends,

In the newsletter April 1, I determined the location and men present for two award ceremonies in New Caledonia in 1943. After this, I decided to look at the rest of our award ceremonies, including for the Good Conduct Medal. This took from March 16 to 25, about 14 hours/day.

I spent March 23-24 putting all my award orders (105 for air awards, 4 for the Good Conduct Medal) on a new page on the Thirsty13th website, so relatives may find and download these.

AIR MEDAL

For meritorious achievement while participating in sustained operational flight missions in the South and Southwest Pacific area, during which hostile contact was probable and expected. These operations consisted of transporting troops and supplies to forward positions and bringing wounded to rear area hospitals in an unarmed transport aircraft. Flights were accomplished over hazardous land and sea routes where inclement weather was frequently encountered, and landings were often made within a few miles of enemy bases. The courage and devotion to duty displayed during these flights are worthy of commendation.

1. Additional History
a. Award Orders

The squadron yearbook, "Two Years c/o Postmaster" (a scan of which is on the thirsty13th website), has the two pages above, listing recipients of the Distinguished Flying Cross ("DFC") and Air Medal ("AM"). After each man's name, a parenthetic indicates how many additional times he received this same award, for which he received Oak Leaf Clusters ("OLCs") that were pinned to the ribbon for the medal. At least 9 men not listed above in *Two Years* received the Air Medal.

As shown at right, air awards were earned by at least 249 men. The Good Conduct Medal award was earned by 275 men. Subtracting out 71 men who received both awards, 453 men, 56% of all, are on an award order.

The DFC was awarded for 200 flight hours in 1942 to Guadalcanal, and the Air Medal for each 100 hours of "combat time." My April 2017 newsletter showed the combat time shrank as we moved west. As shown below right, air crew (in the blue section) who joined before 1944 were 86% (215/249) of those awarded.

- For All Enlisted {
 - E1 is who is on the Good Conduct Awards lists, in the sequence listed.

Welcome

According to an infantryman in the Ninth General Hospital in New Caledonia: "Much as it pleased us to see our bombers and fighters up there working for us, the only time we actually cheered was when we sighted a C-47. That meant food, mail, care for the wounded and all the things we're fighting this war for."

Many people when they think of military airplanes think of only fighters and bombers, but there is a third type: the cargo plane. The C-47 was so important that General, and future President, Eisenhower wrote in "Casside in Europe": "Four pieces of equipment that most senior officers came to regard as among the most vital to our success were the bulldozer, jeep, 2 1/2 ton truck, and the C-47," and this was the only aircraft he mentioned.

Flying cargo planes was **more dangerous** than being in a fighter or bomber, because the C-47 was a large target, slow (150 MPH), a valuable target (it carried airplane fuel, torpedos, guns, supplies, and important people and messages), had no protective armor (no thick steel plates in the walls by the pilots), and it was unarmed. How many people would like to fly one of these into a battle area? Very few.

C-47 pilots also faced another and often more deadly force than enemy aircraft: the weather. Fighters and bombers usually flew only in good weather, and had oxygen to climb above low storms. C-47s took off regardless of the weather - the personnel, supplies, and mail had to go through. Because it did not provide oxygen for the passengers, they also had to stay below 12,500 feet. Many aircrews lost their lives due to encounters with bad weather and mountains. Flying cargo planes in the South Pacific, an area known for intense storms, long distances over water, and mountainous islands, may therefore have been one of the most treacherous flying positions in World War II.

This website is dedicated to preserving the memory of one of the first military transport squadrons, and arguably the best ever, the U.S. Army Air Corps 13th Troop Carrier Squadron, also known as the Thirsty 13th. Their history was written in a highly-detailed 800-page book, and continues to be written in newsletters, with links to these below.

In 2010 I purchased one of the first 13 aircraft they flew to the South Pacific in 1942 to be restored, to bring people literally in touch with the squadron 75 years later, but that did not go as planned.

Good Conduct Medal Award

The Good Conduct Medal Award was established in June 1941. It was awarded for three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service," i.e. no non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses. It was amended March 31, 1943, to start the 3-year clock on August 27, 1940. Men received extra pay each week if they had this, and so had a financial incentive to have good conduct.

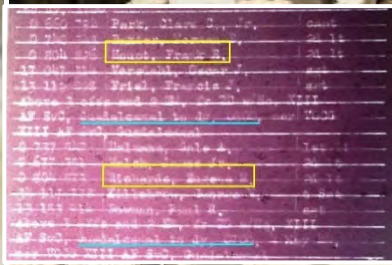
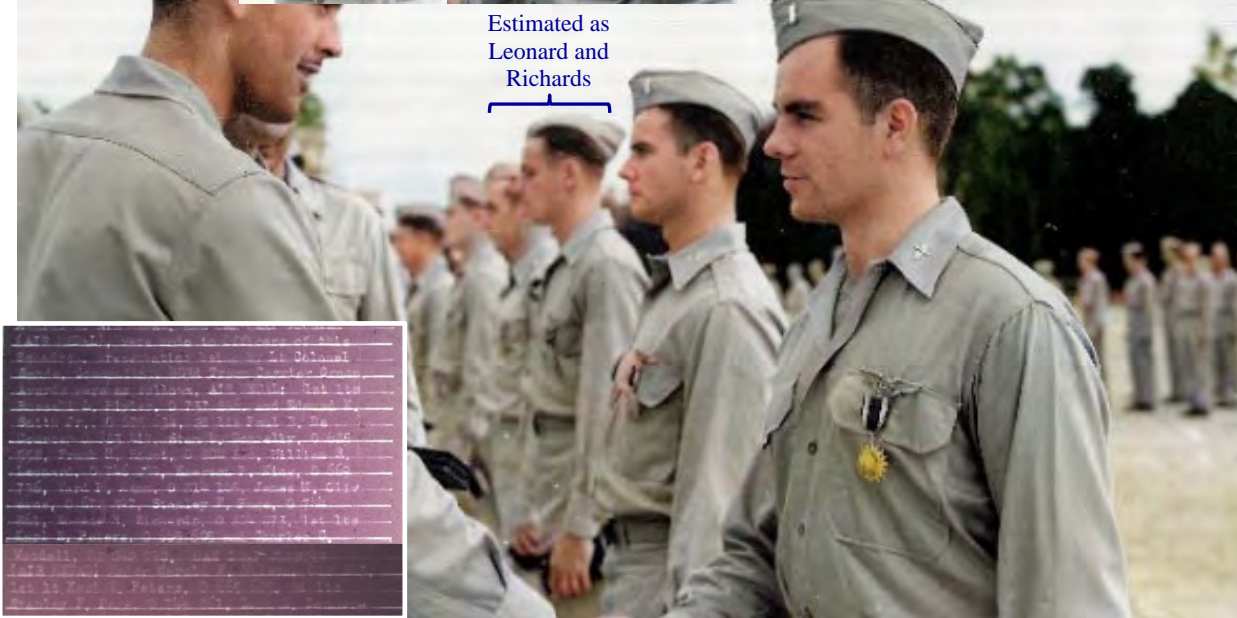

The morning report bottom left lists these men (not those back in the states) as awarded May 6. Removing the 8 on missions, and 8 who had returned to the US, one has 9 left, found pictured above. 403rd TCG Col. Sands presented the awards.

Below are close-ups of Wilson (OLC), EK Smith (AM), Peters (AM+ 2OLCs), Page (AM+2 OLCs), Donnelly (AM), and below them is W. Mann (AM). Houpt, below right, returned from Guadalcanal at 8 a.m., bottom right, and may have missed this. He wears his Air Medal by a large tree. Richards landed at 7 a.m.

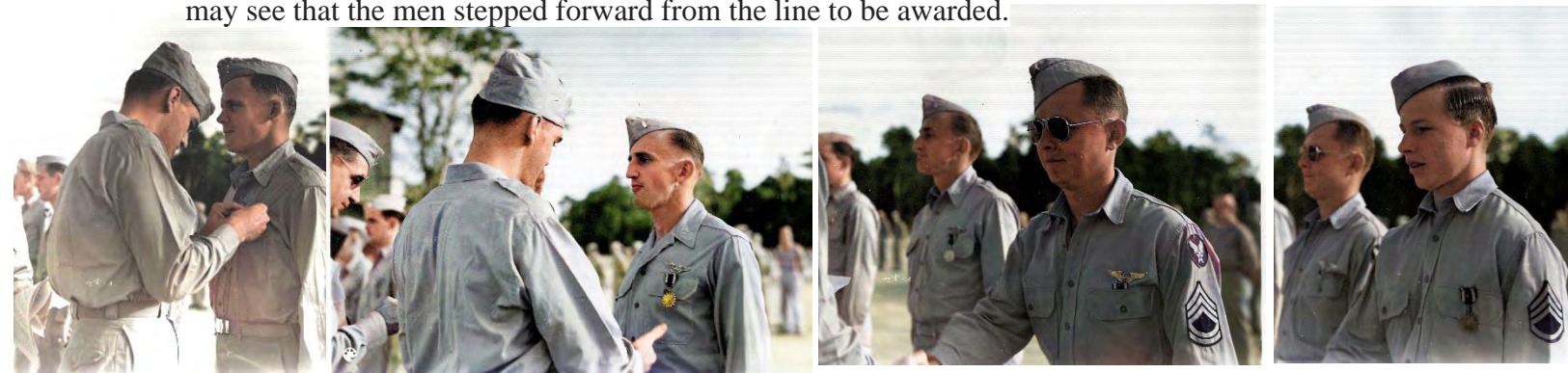

9. **Saturday, May 13, 1944** – The morning report, above, for May 13, states the OLC to the AM (not the AM itself) was awarded to “9 officers and 2 enlisted men.” The men may be estimated from eleven orders, on page C2 #35-45, issued April 25-27, 1944, less men named for a May 20 ceremony.

On May 13, four men, highlighted in red at right, were on missions. Five on those orders, shaded in green, were back in the U.S. Whitaker and Dalmann, received their award in a separate ceremony (below). The 9 officers are therefore estimated as those 1 to 5 at right, plus the four away in red. The two enlisted were Killebrew and Kilzer. Lesh received no OLCs, and would be one too many officers, so is estimated to have received the AM separately.

Pictured below estimated on this day are Hetzler, Copeland, Killebrew, and Kilzer – these three standing together. From the latter two photos, one may see that the men stepped forward from the line to be awarded.



The monthly reports had the photos below, estimated behind Wilson’s operations hut, and are labelled as OLCs awarded to Whitaker and Dalmann. Both were in the camp on May 13, and perhaps this informal ceremony was later the same day.

This was not at a parade-ground formation or was reenacted.

12. **Saturday, June 17, 1944, 7:15 a.m.** – “At presentation formation” Wilson presented OLCs to Park, Lesh, and A. Miller.

13. **Saturday, July 1, 1944** – “A presentation of Air Medal was made” to Painter “with appropriate ceremonies” by Wilson.

14. **Tuesday, August 15, 1944** – “at an appropriate ceremony” the DFC was presented to Watkins. He left 2 days later.

Six-Month Pause, then at Biak - the first three award ceremonies in 1945 were to men leaving for the U.S. and may not have been in front of formations.

15. **Thursday, February 1, 1945** – The morning report at right noted the award to Skeens of an OLC (GO 263), GW Alexander 4 OLCs (GO 257, 258, 260, 261), to Paucek the AM (GO 253), and Lawyer an OLC (GO 261). The first two left the squadron the next day, the last two left the same day, for the U.S.

16. **Saturday, February 3, 1945** – HC Meyers was awarded an OLC to the AM, per GO #262, 12/20/44. He departed the next day for the US.

The awards included 35 Air Medals, and 71 OLCs, nearly the same count as in the near column, and so the near column is estimated to be the award recipients plus 1 or 2. Nine men were away, leaving 45 men in the formation.

The formation is shown below, from the book's page 631, colorized. The first row seems to be #33-45, Park to Linkenhoger. There are two more rows for #1 to #32. Ando has his M/Sgt rank on his sleeve, and may be after Bell. McDaniel is in the 3rd row, Lalonde the 2nd, both being tall.

In April 2017 I asked my consultant friend at Maxwell AFB, George Cully, to find award orders when I knew the order number. Many of these are listed as missing at Maxwell, too. I hope to find someone with them someday.

At left is a summary of the award ceremonies.

- **1943 (New Caledonia):** 2 ceremonies at the airfield.
- **1944 (New Hebrides):** 12 ceremonies, 9 during the Saturday morning formations/inspections on the parade ground. The largest were 4/8, 5/6, 5/13, and 5/20. The 8 others were to 1-to-4 men, perhaps in private.
- **1945 (Biak):** 7 ceremonies. 2 were large and at the ballfield. 3-5 were to men who left the same or next day, perhaps in private.
- **Only about 52% (186 of 361) of the men were present for their awards.**

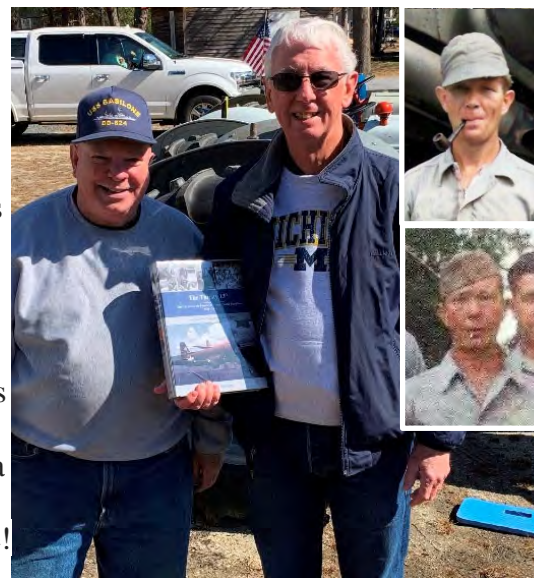
