I. AIR MEDAL -- Award to Person Missing in Action. By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order No. 9158, 11 May 1942 (Bulletin 25, ND, 1942), as amended by Executive Order No. 9242-A, 11 September 1942 (Bulletin 49, ND, 1942), an Air Medal, is awarded by the Commanding General, Thirteenth Air Force, to the following named enlisted man missing in action:
